Today is the last Sunday in the liturgical year and the parable is the last one in Matthew's gospel. The gospel parable of the last judgment continues the king and shepherd themes from Ezekiel. At the end of time Jesus, the Shepherd King, will return, take his seat on his throne and, surrounded by his retinue of angels, will judge the nations. He will share his glory with those he finds worthy. What will his standard be for judging? Who will "inherit the kingdom" that has been prepared for them?

Jesus calls "blessed" those whose lives reflected that of Jesus: the merciful who acted kindly towards the poor, the sick, the homeless, the prisoners and the strangers. Jesus describes "the least" as his sisters and brothers. Jesus' parable opens our imagination and invites us to look around at our lives and our world. Who are the least God is calling me to serve? The great King, Jesus on his throne, has identified himself with them. Where they are, there is Jesus.

The message of this Gospel is very clear. The parable presents many possibilities for service, We can respond to the needy, not only through church organisations, but with groups who serve the poor, hungry, sick, imprisoned and homeless. All who do good are serving Christ, whether they know it or not. But we Christians, guided by this parable, have the gift of being aware that he is the source and goal of our service. So, moved by Christ, we knowingly serve him in his sisters and brothers who need us.
