Eighteenth Sunday In Ordinary Time 4th August 2024 –Year B

This week, brothers and sisters, we celebrated the feast of Saint Ignatius of Loyola. He was that very famous father to that famous society of priests, the Jesuits. Ignatius is remembered, among many things, for his teaching on seeking God's counsel. We often seek God's counsel in prayer when some important decision is before us. In his *Spiritual Exercises*, the saint invites us to meditate on the *ends* and *means* of deciding. Understandably, we are usually anxious to make the 'right choice'. By right choice, we mean the one with the best outcome, or *end*. We select the Holy Trinity as our *means* of deciding. Consequently, we go to prayer seeking a sign or push in the right direction. Sometimes, we have already decided and we simply want the Lord's blessing (Ps 20: 2). Ignatius certainly encourages us to ask God's blessing on our prudent choices (Ps 20: 5-6). Prudence is a virtue and the faithful are called to be virtuous (Prov 8: 11-12). At the same time, the saint challenges you and I to reverse our usual ordering of *ends* and *means* when deciding. He invites us to see our important choices as *means* of glorifying the Holy Trinity (1 Cor 10: 31). He invites us to see God's glory as the *end* of every decision. It seems to me that, if we adopt Ignatius' view, there can many right choices when the time comes to decide.
